RMDS Needs You: Consider Volunteering for a Position with RMDS

Six Reasons Why You Should Get Involved

RMDS is your Group Member Organization of USDF (GMO). Created more than 50 years ago, we are one of 8 clubs that comprise Region 5, and we have well over 500 members. As a nonprofit, our organizational structure is almost entirely volunteer-dependent, and as such, RMDS cannot function without member involvement. RMDS currently has several leadership positions open and many support positions available.

1. YOU ARE WANTED! RMDS needs new members to bring new ideas, creativity and to offer input. Sadly, far too many people see their GMO as just one more club they must sign up in order to compete. Some people may be hesitant to step up and accept a position within the club because they are new to the sport, feel as they don't know much about dressage, or perhaps because they are low-level

that if you step up, you will not be alone, we promise not to overburden you, and we will help you be successful in your efforts.

2. No Man Is an Island: Your GMO is a critical part of your circle of support. Successful competitors know that dressage is not an individual sport, and have a network that is broad, strong, and far-reaching. For what is competition, but a coming together of lovers of the sport to show our best. Great riders understand this and work closely with their local GMOs to preserve, build, enhance, grow, and foster a community that serves as the dance floor where riders share and celebrate the love of the sport. Your support circle must include others who “get it.” When you volunteer, you help the organization, and at the same time, you create a wider network of people who can help you grow and lift you up in your sport.

3. Grow a healthy community. While you might not be able to “see” a community, we all know what it feels like to be part of a healthy, vibrant, and inclusive platform where we all can participate. Unfortunately, without strong participation from everyone, the same brave, tired, people end up shouldering all the work. This is unfair and can lead to cranky and resentful members. An organization can only serve the community well and offer new and exciting opportunities if there are sufficient volunteers to help implement these activities. No one wants a stagnant organization that only has the bandwidth to keep things afloat, barely managing to keep up with the status quo.

4. Educate yourself. As riders, we put so much effort into dressage—the countless hours of practice and lessons, not to mention the huge financial investment. But is this all that you do, you are missing out. You must be invested in your GMO to truly understand the world of competition. Your GMO is always there for you if you learn how to access their resources and the best way to do this is by getting to know people at the organizational level.

5. Give back. The satisfaction of giving back and helping others through the GMO community cannot be understated. Part of your love of dressage should be about sharing and promoting the sport. We learn best when we share our understanding and passion with others. As you share, you gain a deeper understanding of the sport.

6. Participate at the local level, support the national level. Most people don't realize that, as an umbrella organization under USDF, the work we do here in our backyard supports the dressage community throughout the entire US. USDF has over 100 affiliated dressage clubs. By joining your local GMO, you automatically become a group member of USDF. As a member, you provide both financial support and are part of the USDF governance. Each year, our GMO sends delegates to the USDF National Convention, who represent our interests.

Please reflect on your ability to serve and consider growing your involvement with your club. In November, we will be electing new Board Members. Perhaps it's time to get off the sidelines and take a step into making your organization the best it can be.

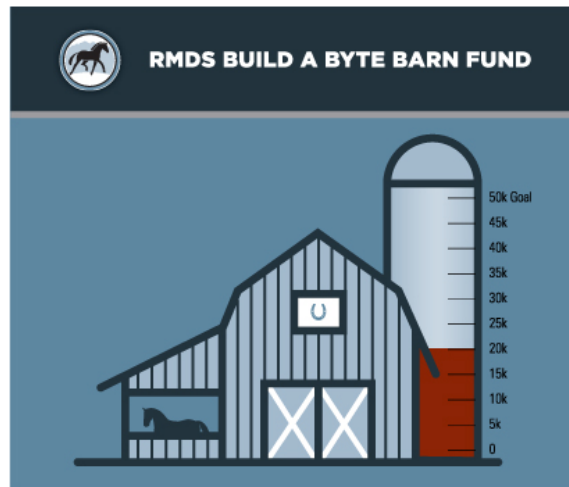
