## North American Championships: What Does it Take to Go?

Every rider has goals that they are striving for, whether they are receiving a 60%, riding the Grand Prix, or even just going down centerline for the first time. These may be goals for some youth riders, but many have their minds set on competing in the North American Youth Championships (NAYC). Competitors come from the United States, Canada, Mexico, Bermuda, and potentially several other countries, and compete in show jumping, dressage, or eventing. In the dressage portion, competitors will be showing in front of a panel of impressive international judges.

This year's NAYC will be occurring August 9-14 in Traverse City, Michigan and we have seven riders competing for Region 5! There are four talented riders who are riding on the Region 5 Junior team: Audrey Allen from CO, Katie Nayak from AZ, Kali Riddell from AZ, and McKenzie Miller from AZ. Along with the Juniors, two impressive riders are on the Region 5 Young Riders team: Olivia Williams from CO and Elizabeth Petersen from CO. It is a huge honor that they have all qualified for the USDF Region 5 team. Hours upon hours of preparation and qualifying have been put in by each of these individuals in order for them to find success in making the team.

Through a competition such as NAYC, youth riders develop a clear understanding of what it means to work as a team and how to be a true sportsman. Lifelong connections are made between fellow teammates, competitors from other regions and countries, along with riders from other disciplines.

#### EXPENSES:

- \$934 for entry/stabling per horse
- Approximately \$150 per person for team clothing
- \$380 for the team golf cart
- Diesel is ~\$6.00 per gallon currently
- Hotel rooms in Traverse City, Michigan are currently going for \$300+
