Office fee (non-refundable)	\$40
Class fee (per class)	\$35
Equitation (class 18 and 48, 71)/Costume/Leadline (per class)	\$25

WDAA or WDACO memberships are not required but encouraged. However, if you wish to qualify for the World show or any Awards Programs you must be a member. Questions? Contact Simone.

There has been an increase of EHV-1 in the United States – we therefore require proof of vaccination (flu/rhino) within 6 months of participation. We recommend that your horse has been vaccinated at least 14 days before the show to achieve immunity. You can show proof via a vet bill or the receipt of vaccine purchase if you administer it yourself.

All horses traveling from out of state must have a health certificate dated within 30 days of horses' arrival at the show as well as a copy of a negative Coggins test dated within the

12 months of the show date and a current vaccination record. Your health certificate will be checked at the show office.

Stall strip fee: \$50 (you must provide a separate check for this when you check in – upon confirmation that you have stripped your stall you can either pick up your check or we will shred it after the show).

Please note – no shavings are available – you must bring your own.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events.

All non-competitors who will be on the grounds (grooms, family, assistants) need to sign a WDACO liability release. The release is available online here – Or you can sign once you enter the show grounds in the show office.

Under Colorado law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities.

Online entries are available using PayPal – you do not need to create a PayPal account to use this option. Ride times will be sent via e-mail and will be posted on the website and Foxvillage.

Refunds: Up to June 20, 2025 all fees refunded except office fee. From day after closing to the day prior to competition, class fees will be refunded only if ride(s) can be filled from wait list. During competition no refunds including Acts of God. ***Office fee is non-refundable.***

Arenas: Indoor arena is a sand mix arena, outdoor warmup arena is sand.

Intro and Basic tests will be held in the small arena (20 m x 40 m). All other tests will be held in the large arena (20 m x 60 m), including ALL Freestyle classes. We reserve the right to combine, split or cancel classes based on entries.

Awards: Ribbons to 5th place all divisions. First place prizes. Management reserves the right to break ties. High Point awards will be given for each division; Open, Amateur, Junior, Gaited Open, Gaited Amateur, and Gaited Junior. There will also be a High Point Overall award for the rider with the highest score regardless of level or Division.

Show committee: The show committee reserves the right to cancel or split classes; limit class size; change arenas; limit the number of rides & number of horses per rider; and cancel or add judges. The show committee also reserves the right to refuse any entries. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Directions: Take I-25 to the Plum Creek Exit #181. Turn left at the signal onto Plum Creek Parkway. Go east on Plum Creek Parkway, approximately one mile to Fairgrounds Road (the 3rd signal light). Turn left on Fairgrounds Road. Once you are on the Fairgrounds keep going east between indoor arena and admin building until you get to end of road. Turn left (north) and follow along the indoor arena to parking and barns.

There are several restaurants and fast-food choices within a 5-mile radius.

Classes and Ride times:

Classes are Western Dressage Classes per United States Equestrian Federation.

Freestyle Classes – please provide a USB flash drive containing your music or email an MP3 file to Simone. Musical freestyle sound check is during the morning break and the afternoon/evening before the show.

You may enter any class you wish. You may enter multiple classes; however, you cannot ride two non-consecutive levels (i.e. Intro and Level 2) on the same horse. We recommend that you keep your entries to a maximum of four classes per horse per day. Class schedule will not be in order of the class list but rather based on entries. Specific ride time(s) will be emailed to you before the show and available on Foxvillage.

Numbers: You will be provided with a bridle/halter number for each horse/rider combination. Horses must always have a bridle number attached when outside of their stall.

Horses Not Competing: Non-competing horses must have a separate entry and pay the office fee, trailer-in or stabling fee. Proof of vaccination is also required.

Attire and Equipment: USEF rules and guidelines will be used for attire and equipment. For more information, please review the USEF rules WD 120, 121, 122, and 123. An ASTM safety helmet is required whenever riding for competitors under the age of 18. Proper footwear is required for all competitors.

Dogs: No dogs are allowed on the premises.

Hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accident Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies.

Other: Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current USEF/WDAA rules will be judged in accordance therewith.

Scores: Tests will be scored and posted outside the show office. It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day. Tests and ribbons are available after the class is completed. Please allow at least 30 minutes from the class's last ride time before sending a designated person to pick them up. Scores will also be available on Foxvillage.

Facility Information Stabling: Please stop at the show office to obtain your stall assignments and bridle numbers and sign Liability Release prior to unloading. Stall fee does not include shavings, buckets for water or feed. If you require shavings, you must bring your own. The stall chart will be posted in the large animal barn on the evening before the show. We request that stalls be requested in advance of the show.

Early Arrival and Extended Stay: On the entry form please indicate your arrival and departure dates if you are reserving stalls. A scheduled arrival time may need to be arranged, and additional day stall fees may apply for early arrivals or extended stays.

Schooling: The indoor arena will be available for warm up and getting horses accustomed to the surroundings on Saturday evening from 5 to 7 PM. NO LUNGEING IN THE INDOOR ARENA.

Warm-up and lunging arenas: Warm up and lunging areas will be available outside before and during the show.

Parking: Parking for horse trailers and RV hookups will be next to the Large animal barn.
