# Will Lead Pre-Cert for USDF Instructor Certification Program and Conduct JR/YR Clinic

Olympic Bronze Medalist and 2003 World Cup Finals Champion Debbie McDonald this fall for two special events: September 17-18, 2005 as part of the USDF Instructor Certification Program at Canon Ridge Farm, and October 22-23, 2005 for a JR/YR clinic at Crooked Willow Farm. The Pre-Certification program for Certified Instructor candidates is a closed session for candidates

only. The JR/YR clinic will be open to

auditors.

"We are thrilled that Debbie McDonald is coming to Colorado," said Deborah Cranston, Canon Ridge Farms' owner. "When the USDF asked us if we would like to host the event, we jumped at the chance." This is the second USDF program held at Canon Ridge In 2004, the USDF Trainers Symposium, featuring Kathy Connelly was held at the farm. Attendees came from around the country to learn from Connelly. Connelly will be joining forces with Toine Hoefs on October 14-16 for an RMDS educational clinic, also to be held at Canon Ridge (see clinic article and registration in this issue).

The USDF Pre-Certification program is a mock testing situation designed to help candidates become familiar with the testing format. Riding, teaching, lungeing and oral sessions are conduct-


ed. Those that are ready can register for the final exam and hopefully become USDF Certified Instructors, an elite classification.

"I think it's a fantastic program," McDonald said of the USDF Instructor Certification. "We need guidelines so not everyone can just hang out a shingle as a trainer." McDonald was a member of the silver medal winning team at the 2002 World Championships, among many international accomplishments.

The two of them are being brought in to present a clinic on Conformation and Development of the Dressage Horse from Weanling to Grand Prix. On Friday Oct 14 Toine will look at young sporthorse prospects and discuss with the audience what you are looking for in Dressage and Jumping prospects. He will review with the audience what the Dutch Stallion Judges are taught to examine, and bring his lifetime of experience judging and selecting young stallion prospects to share with the participants. In the afternoon he will look at 3-5 year olds in hand and under saddle, and discuss their conformation and how it will affect their training plan for the weekend.

On Saturday Toine and Kathy will look at the mature horse group, and discuss with the participants what conformation aspects are manifested in the horses' performance and start working on exercises that affect those issues. Saturday afternoon the young horses will be worked again under saddle, with continuing direction on specific exercises to balance and develop issues

related to the conformation of the young horse.

Saturday evening Toine and Kathy will be available for discussion and questions after an appetizer buffet for all auditors and participants.

Sunday will be the conclusion of work for the mature horses, presented mainly by Kathy and incorporating any long line or in hand work that may also enhance the development of these horses.

### **Ralf Schmitzer Clinic Review**

from Petra Lechner-Jorah

Ralf and Martina Schmitzer have over 25 years of experience in teaching the Classic School of Riding. Originally both were very active, successful riders in dressage competitions and taught accordingly. After 20-30 minutes of exercises I had a very willing horse and I was able to trot my horse in a very supple and relaxed, yet collected frame. Ralf says that any horse, properly trained by his method can show large results and will be able to work for you and will stay sound well into a high age."

"Ralf is a fantastic instructor who teaches every rider to feel their horse and understand what the horse's reaction means to each movement the rider executes."

#### **Bridget Milnes and "Schnitzel"**

"During the three-day clinic, Ralf drew from his extensive experience as a rider, trainer and teacher. Each horse/rider combination was treated to Ralf's keen eye as he identified small faults before they developed into major resistances. In my case, he noted that the walk needed to be more active. So, with a little help from the ground, "Schnitzel" became more energetic with a supple and lifted back. This work carried over into the trot and canter, and movement was effortless.





## **Nutrition Q & A**

#### TRANSITION FEED FOR NEW HORSE

Dear Gretchen:

I just bought a Hanoverian gelding and would like to safely transition his feed from what he has been eating onto what I have here at home. I feed an orchard/brome mix of grass, while he has been on mostly alfalfa. He has also been on a high protein sweet feed with added nutrients. How do I best transfer him over to a grass hay and lower protein grain mix?

Dear New Owner:

First of all, congratulations on your new horse!

You mentioned that he is a Hanoverian, so I will assume that he is a good-sized horse. What is important to understand is that he will most likely eat you out of house and home for awhile until he gets more balanced nutritionally. So, free choice grass hay will be important in this transition process. The free choice grass hay is also one of the best sources to keep a horse's gut moving properly.

Since he is used to a diet loaded with alfalfa, he will most likely not prefer your straight grass hay. I would still feed him maybe a small, skinny flake of alfalfa or grass/alfalfa mixed hay for two weeks or so, while you are providing the free choice grass. Please do not free choice the alfalfa or grass/alfalfa mix hay ever!

There are some things to be aware of during this two week transition period. It is very common for horses that have been on quite a bit of alfalfa and also any high protein grain or concentrate to lose a lot of water weight in a matter of weeks. Because your horse has been on both, I would like to prepare you. There is a really good chance that he will not only be drinking a ton of water to help flush his kidneys from the higher protein and toxicity from the sugars, but with that, he will also be detoxifying and quite possibly could lose even 300 pounds of water weight. I have seen it with my own eyes more than once.

Referring back to my past articles on pH balance, a horse who has been eating a diet high in protein will most likely look like he's in good flesh, but take the high protein away and you can literally watch the weight fall right off of him. He's not losing lean muscle mass, but instead, water. The body holds onto water therefore diluting the acid from the high protein meals.

Because you will be slowly relieving him of the prior toxicity he has been unfortunately eating, you may also notice some other detoxification symptoms. He may have loose stools, he may be cranky (which is typical during a cleanse as the toxins are being released from the body), or he may even lose some hair. I once heard of a horse that, after being on a no-sugar, lower protein diet for a month, lost all of his hair down to looking like

he had "pig-bristles". Can you imagine how scared his owner must have been? He then grew the most slick and shiny coat the owner said she had ever seen on him. That's how detoxification sometimes rears its' head.

When people are prepared for the detox symptoms, it doesn't seem as scary. The key is to go slowly. If you decide that you want to take a full month to switch him over to your orchard/brome grass and plain grains, that's more than fine. Since you do not know him and how sensitive his system might be, possibly one full month of transitioning is best. Better safe than sorry. I do encourage you, however, to feed him a good probiotic daily during this time. Not a live probiotic though, remembering that the live organisms will only be killed off in the stomach acid and not reach the intestines where the beneficial gut bacteria reside.

When the body is finally relieved of stress, be it chemical, nutritional, environmental, or emotional, it can then have the required energy to get rid of toxicity that has been in the body for years and years, even decades. I always tell people, "Better <u>out</u> than <u>in</u> when it comes to toxins." The key is just go slowly enough as to not send the body into what I term a "healing crisis." That is where the symptoms of detox are pretty difficult to handle: diarrhea, abscesses, lethargy, etc.

As far as your daily training sessions with him, I would encourage you to take it easy this first month. He needs the extra energy to detoxify. I am not saying to not ride him, but do take it easy. This will also be a good time for you two to start bonding with out the added stress of having to perform. Focus on getting him healthy!

#### Nutrition Q & A continued

#### FLAXSEED AND RICE BRAN

Hello Centaur, I read with interest the nutrition article by Gretchen Topel and I do have a question for her. So many supplements now come with a base of flaxseed and some pretty hardy with flaxseed. How does flaxseed use for horses compare and is it recommended? Also, if rice bran is not preserved with animal fat, is it ok?

Thanks so much for writing in to the Centaur...and your wonderful questions.

FLAX SEED: Linseed or flax is acknowleged as goitrogenic due to the cyanogenetic linamarin that it contains. Cyanides in small amounts (especially in the absense of adequate iodine) are known to be goiter producing and thyroid-inhibiting. In cases of hypothyroidism, according to Equine Medicine and Surgery, the diet should also be evaluated for the presence of ingredients containing antithyroid compounds, such as linseed, raw soybeans. According to Poisonous Plants of North America, the poisonous principle is "leaves and seed chaff contain the cyanogenetic glycoside, linamarin, and enzyme (linamarase) is present in the plant material which is capable of releasing cyanide from linamarin. The production of cyanogenetic glycoside in the plant varies with genetic and ecological conditions under which the plants are produced. (A cold snap will produce more cyanide in the seed). Immature seed is also more likely to be toxic than mature seed."

Linseed is widely used in the beef industry as a deliberate thyroid inhibitor, so the animals put on weight faster and get to market quicker. Dr. Regan Golob has also noted that linseed or flax does not test well using kinesiology and thyroid reflex points on people and horses. I have no doubt about its ability to put on weight and give a shiny coat, and in the presence of a balanced mineral profile with adequate iodine and fed in very small amounts, many people get away with it just fine. I personally prefer not to take the chance, especially when I believe there are safer options out there. If one does choose to feed flax seed to their horses, they need to boil it for at least 10 minutes, preferably longer, before feeding. That will destroy most of the unwanted enzyme activity that makes flax toxic. That would probably be reason enough for me to not feed it. Standing over the stove to boil a handful of flax into a gelatin goop daily before feeding is a bit of work! Make sure you buy organic flax seed from the health food store. Like a lot of other supplements that are fed to cattle and sheep and other livestock which are raised for food (and are lucky to see their first birthday), the long term toxic or thyroid inhibiting effects of flax can be a whole different thing for a performance athlete that will hopefully live a useful life into their 20's and beyond.

Hypothyroidism is becoming rampant in the horse world. This experience came from one of my business associates: I remember a the noted Arab trainer of

national fame back in the 70's and 80's in Washington was noted for feeding flax. He would just throw in a cup or so at the evening grain feed, uncooked of course. His halter horses were legendary, they could pool water down the creases in the middle of their backs, they were so fat. And shiny!! And he had virtually NO winning performance horses. They were wacko and could not move freely, and he had a lot of trouble getting mares in foal.

Yes, there is info on the net that supports flax seed, but it's really about making informed choices. From what I know about flax seed, I do not choose to use it. Toxicity is such a problem, if I know that something is toxic or out of balance, or even is potentially toxic, I choose not to feed it. A good website to check out on flax is Dr. Joseph Mercola's: <a href="https://www.mercola.com">www.mercola.com</a>

**RICE BRAN:** Rice bran will cause liver reactions in most horses, as most rice is very heavily treated with herbicides and/or pesticides in growing. Also bran of any kind (wheat included) is very high in phosphorus and also in phytic acid, both of which tie up calcium. Bottom line: high phytate, high phosphorous both tie up calcium. Rice is a very heavy chemicalized crop, with herbicides, pesticides, etc. often applied. Rice is at the top of the list on Consumer's Reports for being one of the most chemically treated crops. Always buy/eat organic rice for yourself and your family. Toxins will only break down the body over time, while putting undue stress on the organs of elimination, not to mention clogging up the liver.

I don't intend to denigrate anyone's feeding program, only to educate. Feel free to ask more questions if you'd like to. This is how we ALL learn! Thanks for your inquiry.


Ralf emphasized the correctness of the rider position, as it impacts the horse's ability to carry us. How often have I asked my wonderful horse to do something in the hardest way possible for her to perform it? Besides my position, we did a lot of exercises to encourage the horse to "carry" the rider's weight properly and specifically by each leg. This was all taught in manner of accomplishment without negativity and in a calm manner. Ralf's teaching is very close to horse & rider, therefore he does not miss the smallest variation in position or response. I can highly recommend this clinic and I look forward to Ralf's return!"

#### Siri Downie and "Radio Flyer"

Recently my husband gave me the wonderful opportunity for mother's day to attend the 4-day clinic presented by Ralf Schmitzer.

I have always been fascinated by the more Classical form of Dressage. I brought my coming 4 year old Trakhener "Rad" that had a little showing at schooling shows and one lesson with my regular trainer, but considerable training was done at home. The first day of the clinic was observation for Ralf. Ralf first checked my tact to make sure nothing would compromise my horse's comfort. He recommended a wider brow band to my bridle so it would not cut into the back of Rad's ears. Rad was a little nervous in the new surrounding, so Ralf helped me with a few relaxation exercises. The next day we worked on engaging the haunches in the walk and trot. What I really appreciated was the fastness of his training approach. Rad has the tendency to get rushed, drop on his forehand and curl over on his nose. Ralf had me raise my hands, give more rein and widen my hands to match my shoulders more. Rad responded by working in a natural self-carriage. We then introduced haunches in along the long side of the arena. We finished with a small amount of canter work. The next day we repeated the exercises with the introduction of 10m serpentine using minimal hands, just turning my shoulders slightly. Rad, who is very sensitive, thrived under this type of riding and just flowed through the corners; it was a wonderful feeling! On the fourth day we repeated the exercises for engagement. Rad's balance and self-carriage came along nicely and he felt very relaxed as nothing was forced. Ralf introduced riding him more forward and bringing him back with minimal rein aids. I was very appreciative of my horse. I can think of several horses less sensitive that I have ridden I would have struggled with. The main take home message that I understood about the Classical approach is that it is all about the comfort of the horse, using the lightest aids possible. You shouldn't have to be physically strong to ride a truly well trained horse. It is a long, time consuming process to do it correctly with a lot of steps to build upon. I really enjoyed the Clinic and plan to attend again if Ralf comes back (and after the birth of my son).






