NCDA Presents: Circles in the Sand, with Joan Clay

A three-part workshop exploring the geometry of the dressage ring, for riders of all disciplines looking for ways to improve their training. Whether you are training a youngster and not sure what his strengths will be, working to improve your reining pattern, working equitation, dressage, or simply wanting your horse more balanced and fit dressage exercises can help achieve your goals!

A large part of the effectiveness of dressage training is understanding the geometry of the figures used in dressage. Does your youngster tend to fall in on one shoulder? Do you want to improve the flow from movement to movement? Do you often wonder while riding a 20 meter circle if it's really round, and 20 meters? Are your flying changes a zig-zaggy line instead of straight? Do you question where those serpentine should touch the wall, or where and how a transition should take place? These are situations that everyone in all riding styles can relate to.

We have the answers for you!! Or, I should say, Joan Clay does! How accurately the geometry of figures are ridden can improve your training and boost your scores. And, the more you know about how to ride the geometry, the better you and your horse will do! We all work too hard at our riding skills, and improving the partnership with our horses, to lose training and showing success to geometry inaccuracy.

This March, join NCDA as they host Joan Clay and Circles in the Sand: a three-part riders' workshop to better understand, and execute, the geometry of dressage figures. Everyone is welcome to take part and improve their skills, whether preparing for the 2018 show season, trail riding season, or starting a young horse. Circles in the Sand will be held at Tomora Training Center, March 24 and 25, and April 8. Sign up to secure your spot and participate with your horse, or as an unmounted participant.
